It is meant to be a menu from which the schools can select the most helpful options for them.

[Outreach letter to town officials](#)

This letter is designed for teachers or the Social Studies Department Head to send to local town officials to give them a heads up that students are working on these projects and may contact them or town department heads for information needed for the student projects. It gives the local officials some ideas about how they can respond to students. This is a helpful letter to encourage teachers to use since it is sometime difficult for students to receive a reply from people they contact. This letter is modeled on the DESE letter they encourage schools to send to their state representatives.
