



## Legislation Summary:

### An Act relative to MA state sovereignty

Initial bill number(s) H.1401/S.997

Sponsors: Rep. Antonio Cabral, Sen. Adam Gomez

### What the bill does, why LWVMA supports or opposes it, and the League position relative to this bill.

This bill would end all detention agreements with ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement), including 287(g) agreements, which deputize local, county, and state authorities to enforce federal immigration law, and IGSA agreements (Intergovernmental Service Agreements), which allow sheriffs to rent a section of their jails to house immigration detainees. Such agreements would end 90 days after enactment of the bill. Currently, whether or not these agreements get signed is entirely up to the sheriff, with no state oversight. This bill requires that, in the future, any agreement that a sheriff might want to sign would have to first be approved by the Governor.

By ending detention agreements between federal immigration law enforcement and state and local law enforcement, this bill would help protect immigrant families from the harsh consequences that can result from even a minor interaction with immigration officials...detention, deportation, family separation. Massachusetts officials should not be carrying out federal immigration law enforcement, nor should local resources be used for this purpose.

LWVMA supports this bill. The League believes that no one should live in fear of deportation and family separation and that state and local law enforcement officials should have no role in federal immigration law enforcement.
